- I Examinees in the Russian, Hebrew-English and French can take this exam in February 2012. Examinees in Spanish can take this exam only in July 2012. Applicants who take the psychometric exam in Hebrew, Arabic, Russian or combined version English/Hebrew and are holders of a High School Certificate from abroad, can take the exam in July only for the Faculty of Humanities and Faculty of Arts (except for Architecture and Film and Television). Applicants taking the Russian and the combined Hebrew-English version exam in July 2012, may request to consider this exam.
- II For details for registration to this exam, please call the Center of Hebrew studies Office, at least 45 days before each session or visit the NITE website. All candidates must achieve at least the "pass" level (level "alef") prior to the beginning of the academic year. At the end of their first semester, all students must reach the "B" level (level "bet") on their own, possibly by taking the "Yael" exam again. Candidates to Medicine, Dental Medicine and M.A. in Economics, must achieve at least "Bet" level prior to the beginning of the academic year.
- III For all applicants to graduate studies from abroad who have not graduated from an institution where the language of instruction is English and all candidates who have or wish to take this exam, see the Hebrew website: go.tau.ac.il. In order to take this test the student can apply through the NITE website or purchase the registration kit at Office Depot Dyonon bookshop in the Mitchell Building near Gate 7 or in other universities' bookshops. - IV Candidates may take the exam twice. Information concerning examination dates for the second semester will be available at the registration office during November 2012.
- V Candidates holding a French High School Diploma from countries where the language of instruction is French are exempted.
