**Call for Nominations for the Year 2004
in the field of
Observational or Theoretical Astronomy and Astrophysics**

The Raymond and Beverly Sackler Prize in the Physical Sciences was established through the generosity of Dr. Raymond and Mrs. Beverly Sackler. Prizes are awarded each year, in the disciplines of either Physics or Chemistry. The Sackler Prize supports dedication to science, originality and excellence, and it is intended for young scientists who have made outstanding and fundamental contributions in their fields.

The Sackler Prize is administered by Tel Aviv University (TAU) *¹. In 2004 a prize of \$40,000 will be presented for outstanding research in **observational or theoretical astronomy and astrophysics** *². The prize will be awarded to the recipient, in person, at the annual session of the TAU Board of Governors meeting (during the week of 16 May 2004).

There is an age limit of 40 for all nominees. To be eligible the nominee's birth date must be after 15 February 1963.

The coordinator for the 2004 Sackler Prize is Prof. Yuval Ne'eman (TAU).
The assistant coordinator is Prof. Amiel Sternberg (TAU).

An international selection panel composed of leading scientists in the field is appointed each year. The astronomy and astrophysics panel for Year 2004 has been appointed.

Nominations for the Sackler Prize can be made by individuals in any of the following categories:

1. Faculty of Astronomy, Chemistry, or Physics departments in institutions of higher learning world wide.
2. Presidents, Rectors, Vice-Presidents, Provosts and Deans of institutions of higher learning world wide.
3. Directors of astronomical observatories or laboratories world wide.
4. Members of the Tel Aviv University Senate, or of the Israel Academy of Sciences and Humanities.
5. Sackler Prize laureates.

All nominations should be submitted in writing before the deadline of **15 February 2004** to the following address: Prof. Yuval Ne'eman, School of Physics and Astronomy, Raymond and Beverly Sackler Faculty of Exact Sciences, Tel Aviv University, Ramat Aviv 69978, ISRAEL

Nominations should include a brief description of the nominee's achievements, and must be supported by at least two letters of recommendation, and include the nominee's CV and list of publications.

Members of TAU faculty are not eligible to receive the prize. Self-nominations cannot be accepted.
