Digital technologies are transforming every aspect of our life, education included. Philosophers of technology have developed tools to understand these transformations and point to their possible risks. One of the major branches of contemporary philosophy of technology is known as postphenomenology, and it offers systematic analyses of human-technology-world relations. The workshop will offer an introduction into postphenomenology in the context of learning and education in a digitalized world.

This international workshop will host two prominent postphenomenologists from Denmark:

Prof. Catherine Hasse is a Danish full professor at Aarhus University (Denmark) heading the interdisciplinary research program of Future Technology, Culture and Learning (<a href="https://dpu.au.dk/en/research/research-programmes/future-technology/">https://dpu.au.dk/en/research/research-programmes/future-technology/</a>).

Dr. Lars Botin from Aalborg University (Denmark) is one of the founders of the techno-anthropology programme that studies emerging technologies and teaches critical perspectives on technology using PBL. Both are members of the postphenomenology community and have studied robots, learning, engineering education and the Anthropocene.
